



## THE 'WOLVES ROCK' DOLMEN (LA ROCHE AUX LOUPS) Missillac - La Chapelle-des-Marais



 10 km  2 hours 30

### Access

between Missillac and La Chapelle-des-Marais (D 2), at Angle Bertho, follow signs for Sainte-Reine-de-Bretagne (D 4).

This is an exploration through the countryside from the Sérot mill to the Gué Neuf marsh. Along the way, you'll be taken aback by the unusual silhouette of the Roche aux Loups (Wolves Rock) dolmen and listen out for the abundant life in and around the small ponds you'll be passing by.

 At the Maison des Amis de Bergon, turn right onto the road, cross the RD 4, continue and take the first path on the right after the village of Bercéhan. At the next crossroads, turn left and continue for 1 km. Then turn right and go straight on at the next junction towards La Régaudais. In the village, turn right after the bus shelter.

- 1 Take the path on the left and continue for about 1 km before turning right. At the next crossroads, turn left to reach the village of Haut-Bergon. Cross the main road again and continue on the path through meadows and marshes for 2.5 km.
- 2 Then turn right and then immediately left for 700m before turning right again. At the end of the path, turn left to reach the Jô.
- 3 Go through the village and then go up the grassy path to the right. Turn right again and continue for 500m before going left. Continue for another 500m and turn left to reach the Roche aux Loups (Wolves Rock) dolmen. Continue straight on until you reach the Gravelais. Then turn right into the village to get back to the departure point.

### GUÉ NEUF MARSH

Gué Neuf marsh boasts a multitude of ponds, some of them hidden. A lot of small animals, some of which are barely visible, gravitate in and around the ponds. In addition to the well-known frogs, you can also see water beetles, damselflies, dragonflies, diving beetles, but also the great silver water beetle, the ranatra linearis, water boatmen, mayflies, newts or the diving bell spider.


